Professor Henry Pollard is a Sydney-based Sports & Exercise Chiropractor, clinical scientist, academic, and regulator with more than 40 years of private clinical practice experience. He is Director of Cronulla Chiropractic & Sports Injury Centre, an Independent Chiropractic Consultant with the NSW State Insurance Regulatory Authority, Adjunct Professor in the Faculty of Health Sciences at Durban University of Technology, South Africa, and Visiting Professor at the Camara Institute of Chiropractic Sciences in the Philippines. His career has combined frontline clinical care, sports injury management, medico-legal review, professional education, and applied musculoskeletal research.

Professor Pollard has held senior academic and leadership roles across several institutions, including Macquarie University, CQUniversity, Australian Catholic University, and the Australasian Institute of Chiropractic Education, where he served as Head from 2018 to 2024. He has taught for more than 35 years in orthopaedics, sports medicine, clinical management, research methods, rehabilitation, and professional practice. He has also contributed extensively to postgraduate education, research supervision, curriculum development, and professional governance, including long-standing roles with registration, examination, and competency bodies.

An experienced editor, reviewer, presenter, and researcher, Professor Pollard has published more than 160 peer-reviewed manuscripts and has lectured nationally and internationally across chiropractic, sports medicine, manual therapy, clinical reasoning, research, and continuing professional development. He was Editor of the Chiropractic Journal of Australia from 2021 to 2024 and has served as reviewer for multiple chiropractic, sports medicine, rehabilitation, and health journals. In his role as Associate Editor, CPD, for the Asia-Pacific Chiropractic Journal, he brings a strong commitment to evidence-informed education, clinical relevance, professional accountability, and the translation of research into continuing professional development for practitioners across the region.
